A Change in Where the Money Goes

I am excited to announce that beginning June 1 we'll be apportioning our general offering this way:

10% to missions 10% to a building/property acquisition fund 80% to current expenses

Until now undesignated funds have been used in meeting budgeted expenses with a relatively small amount set aside for mission beyond the local church. While much of what we seek to do is in mission to our community (remember "show love" and "go and make disciples" from our mission statement?) I and your other leaders believe that we would do well to focus a substantial portion of our resources beyond ourselves. This will enable us to show love beyond our backyard and to go and make disciples in other corners of the globe.

Just as I counsel families to set aside "a tithe" (10%) for God, I also counsel them to save for future needs. One such need for our church family will likely be property that we own. (Our present, very fine facility is leased.) That's the purpose for setting aside another 10% of undesignated giving as savings for building or acquiring property.

If you are led to make a special gift to either the building fund or missions, you are welcome to do so. Simply designate you gift accordingly. Another option for designated giving is our **Enhancement Fund**, which will be used for facility improvement and capital expenditures. These monies will be used for such purposes as redecorating the altar area in anticipation of mounting the recently purchased cross, replacing our keyboard in the event its broken key can't be repaired, etc.


Vacation Bible School


Pastor's Picks

A Note From Pastor Jeff:

I was recently reading about David's Mighty Men in my Life Journal readings. They were the thirty chief men who stood with King David. Some of their exploits are recounted in 2 Samuel 23. Eleazar stood his ground against the Philistines even while the Israelites retreated; he "struck down the Philistines till his hand grew tired and froze to the sword." On another occasion the Philistines banded together and Israel's troops fled from them. Shammah, another of the mighty men, took his stand, defended the land and struck the Philistines down. In each account the Bible says, "The LORD brought about a great victory that day."

How does one become a mighty man or woman through whom God brings great victory? We often talk about the personal benefits of daily Bible reading and of participating in a small group Bible study. (Remember "to know" and "to grow" from our mission statement?) But these are also means by which God prepares us to be used by him to advance his Kingdom. Every time God uses you in bringing someone to faith in Christ, or in taking another step forward in their discipleship, you are being a mighty man or woman of God and it can be said, "The LORD brought about a great victory that day."
