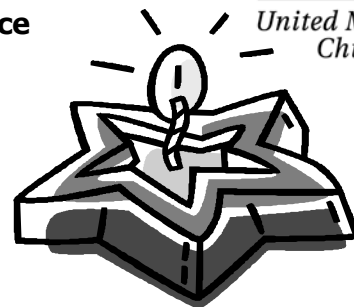

## *Missions Corner*

First Coast Women's Services is a non-profit Christian crisis pregnancy center in Mandarin that opened the doors of a new office in Jacksonville Beach in October. Women who suspect they are pregnant and feeling anxious can come to the center for a variety of services, including pregnancy testing, ultrasound testing, counseling, maternity and baby clothing and help with rent and utilities. The agency educates women on all of their options and offers support for parenting their baby or deciding on adoption. Clients who choose abortion are not judged and are welcome back anytime, should they need crisis pregnancy services again.

Our church is one of several area churches supporting FCWS and is joined by individuals and other organizations, including the PGA Tour. The office is located at 2187 3rd Street S, Jacksonville Beach. 904 246-7378.

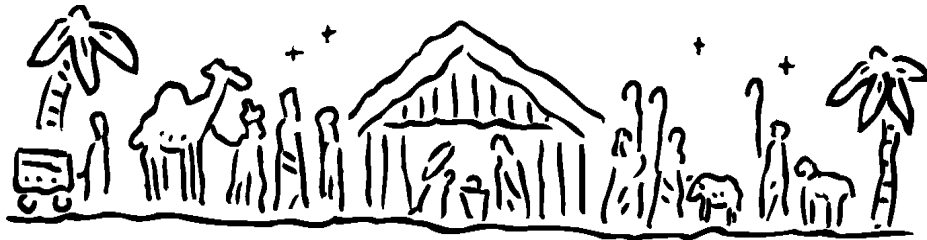

We are not giving the Seller everything they want and it's not possible to say whether the sticking points will be negotiable. When the agreement is signed by the Seller details of the sale (including property location, of course) will be brought to the congregation for your consideration. Congregational approval is a condition of the purchase agreement.

## *A Note From Pastor Jeff.*

"Those who say that the God has begotten a son preach a monstrous falsehood, which the very heavens might crack, the heavens break asunder, and the mountains crumble to dust. It does not become the holy God to beget a son." –The Koran, 19.88-92

We're approaching Christmas, that time of year when Christians trundle out this belief that theologians call "the incarnation." It's quite something, really, this idea that God would not only be "God with us" but come to us as an actual person, Jesus of Nazareth.

Wil Willimon, formerly Dean of the Chapel of Duke University and now a United Methodist Bishop, tells of the student who came to him, distressed that he was losing his faith. Willimon inquired as to what faith he was losing. "I have problems with the virgin birth of Jesus. Don't I have to believe in the miraculous birth of Jesus in order to believe in Jesus?" Willimon replied, "We ask you to believe in the virginal conception of Jesus and, if we can get you to swallow that without choking, then there's no telling what else we can get you to believe. Come back next week and we'll try to convince you that the poor are royalty and the rich are in big trouble, that God not nations rules the world, and on and on. We start you out with something fairly small, like the virgin birth, then work you up to even more outrageous assertions."

God is among us as Jesus, the Word incarnate, the Word made flesh. It is a scandal, God entering God's creation as a particular human being born 2000 years ago. A good reminder that God is not some generic idea to be made into anything we like; God has a face and a name. And God has specific hopes and dreams for us, specific expectations of us. Something to consider this Advent season.
