
Youth

Go Deep

This fall we're offering three opportunities for in-depth study of the Bible. Each requires 30 minutes daily for reading and reflection and 2½ hours for a weekly group meeting. It's a substantial investment but if you make it you'll find yourself reaping incredible dividends. To sign on for DISCIPLE I, DISCIPLE II or JESUS IN THE GOSPELS contact the church office (280-5141). Each group is limited to 12 people.

DISCIPLE I - Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study

Prerequisite: None.

Meets on Wednesdays, 7 - 9:30pm beginning September 6

Leader: *Diane Lee*

This is a general survey of the entire Bible. You will read approximately 70% of the Bible during the 34 weeks. Lesson 33 is a special time of positive affirmation and discernment where each participant will have opportunity to talk about their personal goals for discipleship. The purpose of the study is to develop biblically nourished persons committed to live as disciples.

Each meeting begins with prayer and a short introduction to the topic for the lesson. A video is viewed featuring an expert in the specific subject matter. A discussion period seeks to bring alive the daily readings. Following a break a second discussion time focuses on the discipleship aspect of the lesson. Prayer requests are shared and the session is closed with a prayer.

DISCIPLE II - Into the Word, Into the World

Prerequisite: DISCIPLE I

Meets on Wednesdays, 7 - 9:30pm beginning September 6

Leader: *Jerry Sanders*

This course encourages persons to open themselves to hearing what God has to say to them through the Bible and to be guided into service in the world by Scripture and their study of it. The 32 week study selects specific portions of Scripture and delves deeper into them. Equal attention is given to Old and New Testaments with concentration on four books: Genesis, Exodus, Luke, and Acts. Participants will read familiar passages, see them in fresh ways, and anticipate that God will speak through them.

JESUS IN THE GOSPELS - DISCIPLE Second Generation Series

Prerequisite: None.

Meets on Sundays, 6 - 8:30pm beginning September 10

Leaders: *Gary Proctor & Larry Bradford*

Jesus in the Gospels invites believers to look at Jesus in each of the four Gospels and ask the question "who is the Jesus that you see?" This study will deepen discipleship through better understanding of the biblical texts and their message. Two questions frame this study—"Who is the Jesus you bring with you to this study?" and "Who is the Jesus you take with you from this study?" Jesus in the Gospels takes participants on a journey from one question to the other.

A Note From Pastor Jeff.

I am 45. I have spent the past 11 years pastoring and the three years before that in seminary. Given my work history, I find that I am much wealthier than I thought I'd be at this point in my life. I'm not talking about the wealth of relationships I enjoy; I'm talking about money. Yes, much of it is in retirement accounts but it is still there for my family and me. And my wealth concerns me.

I was reading what John Wesley had to say about grace for the "Word from Wesley" inside this newsletter. I came across these words from a letter Wesley wrote:

It is a sad observation that they that have most money have usually least grace.

In dealing with several property owners over the past two years I suspect that Mr. Wesley is right on the money (pun intended). I suppose that one remedy would be to give it all away. Jesus told one rich young man to do just this, to sell out and give it all to the poor. (See Matthew 19:16-30.) I think the only other possible remedy is to be generous toward others with our time, our money, our attention.

I have received so much in so many ways. God's grace has abounded toward me. Lord help me to extend grace to others in every way possible, that I might not lose the grace you've freely given me. Amen.
