
We'll continue to serve our youth through Sunday evening youth group and Wednesday evening YCAM, as well Sunday School.

Reaching Out During The 40 Days

For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me...I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me. –Matthew 25:36, 40



Reaching out beyond our church walls to those in need is the cornerstone of the *40 Days of Community* program. Jesus calls us as his disciples to minister to those in need; it's a critical part of our walk of faith. This is your opportunity as a small group to reach out with a hands-on project to help neighbors in need in the beaches community. A brief description of each project follows. Time required is approximately 4 hours.

BEAM (Beaches Emergency Assistance Ministry): Help sort canned foods at the BEAM food bank.

BEAM: Create theme baskets, such as golf, coffee, bath and body, or books, to be auctioned off at their October Beach Bash (see Mission Corner).

Habitat: Participate in painting or yard work at a Beaches Habitat home under construction.

Hart Felt Ministries: Give cost-free, non-medical assistance and companionship to our neighbors struggling to remain independent in their homes.

Helping Hands Ministries: Clear underbrush from a lot currently under lease for transitional housing for homeless families.

Meals on Wheels: food delivery volunteers

Military Outreach: In appreciation of the sacrifice families make so their loved ones can serve, hold a "No Dough Dinner" for the enlisted and their families one night before payday. A small group can provide, serve, and clean up following dinner for an estimated cost of \$300 to \$500.

Mission House: Provide needed items for the shower, meal, and clothing programs that meet the needs of the homeless.

Mission House: Additional needs include painting inside walls and exterior doors, stripping and waxing floors, repairing benches in the outside waiting room, and pressure washing the exterior siding.

Pablo Hamlet: HUD housing for seniors needs a group to do housekeeping (dusting, vacuuming, and cleaning bathrooms) as well as to drive them to appointments.

Each of these wonderful organizations provides an outreach opportunity for us to show Christ's love to a hurting world. Take advantage of a one-time opportunity and prayerfully consider an on-going mission focus for your small group in the future.
