Where: San Ramon, Costa Rica

What: Between the two trips, providing Vacation Bible School for 300 and pouring concrete floors for 30 homes.

Why: To share the love of Christ through evangelism and meeting the physical needs of the poor.

Who: Anyone who feels led by God to this ministry in Costa Rica

How Much: \$1,300 (covers transportation, food/lodging, fees, supplies)





We have a new logo! Last year, we renamed our youth ministry H2O (helping, healing, outreach). Based on the design of one of our students, this is our official logo!




### *Pink Flamingo Fundraiser*, March 15.

**Casting Crowns Concert** money due by March 2! \$40/person reserves your space for the March 22 Concert.


**Talent Show 2008**, Friday April 18. Come and see the hidden talents of our church family! Youth members, we are looking for MCs and acts!

Many, if they were willing to be candid, would say that Christians are fools, giving the way we do. Giving not just money but time and effort too. “Just think about how much free time you’d have if you weren’t ministering to youth in the Detention Center, or running an errand for someone who can’t get out, or volunteering at the soup kitchen or the hospital or the schools. And why do you give all that money to the church? You could take a nice vacation / buy a nice car / buy a second home.”

Someone once said, “**He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose.**” That someone was Jim Elliot, a missionary to Ecuador who was killed at age 28 while attempting to evangelize the Huaorani people. Was he a fool to risk his life sharing the gospel with a violent people? Were he alive today, Elliot would be 80. Whether 28 or 80, our days are numbered; we do not live here forever. Yet Elliot has gained life eternal, the life one cannot lose.

It is often said of money and possessions, “You can’t take it with you.” How true. Why not do as much good with our money and possessions and time and talents as we possibly can? Why not give?

Below is a reprint from one of several wonderful thank you letters received from Operation Shoebox recipients. This one has such a heartwarming message we wanted to share it, unedited. Dear Operation Shoebox Volunteer,

In the past two days I've received eight boxes full of Christmas stockings from you. I just want you to know how very much we appreciate all your time and the effort that you spend

preparing these boxes for us. It was a God send and I'd like to share my story with you.

I'm a Christian and I've always loved Christmas. I've always actually enjoyed giving and watching others open their gifts more than receiving gifts myself. I'm 48 years old and have three daughters and one grandson, and am expecting my second grandchild May 27, which will be two months before I get home. My oldest daughter is 29 years old, so in other words, I've been playing Santa for a very long time. The group I am with here is a joint effort of Mississippi and Illinois National Guard Units. There are about 20 females, most of which are very young, some not even 20 years old yet. I'm from Mississippi and the other E-7 female, Louann, is from Illinois. She is 51 and we have become great friends. She also has grown children, so she is used to playing Santa too. I guess we are the "motherly type" and we were talking four days ago and discussing how nice it would be if we had stockings to fill and put on all the girls' beds. Anyway, as I sat and read my devotional that night I kept thinking about those stockings. Most of these girls aren't married and probably have never been away from their parents on Christmas and it's difficult being away from your family. The stocking thing was weighing heavy on my mind all night. I never actually prayed for stockings because I knew that, even if I called someone in the states to send them, they wouldn't have time to get here before Christmas. Well, day before yesterday when the PFC from my section came back from picking up the mail he had four big boxes with my name on them. I had forgotten all about my signing my unit up with your organization, but there they were, four big boxes full of hand-made stockings, already stuffed with snacks and happies. It was over two months ago that I signed up and I know that you had to have started working on sewing all those stockings long before Louann and I even thought about them. Then the next day I received three more boxes, and yesterday one more box. That's a total of 120 stockings, which is about how many enlisted people will be here on Christmas Eve. Now Louann and I can play Santa to all the girls in the barracks! If we receive another box today, we may even share them with the officers!

You answered a prayer that was never even prayed. It just reinforces the fact that God knows what we need, or are going to need, and He is preparing to meet our needs long before we even know that there is a need. Those ladies sewing those stockings had to have been sewing them months ago, probably before I ever even signed up with Operation Shoebox. I am ashamed because I didn't actually pray for the stockings. It seemed so trivial and impossible to get them before Christmas, but God knew the desire of my heart and provided them anyway. It's amazing how many desired items have miraculously appeared over here in boxes sent from people all across the U.S. So, no matter how trivial or silly your wants, needs, and desires may be, or how impossible it may seem, God's able to provide anything, anywhere, at exactly the right time! But He can't do it without earth bound angels like you and your group.

Thank you and Merry Christmas to you and all that helped make our Christmas better.
