New Series Begun July 27

On July 27 we began a five week series focusing on core practices that are becoming known as "The Methodist Way." There is nothing uniquely United Methodist about the practices referred to as "The Methodist Way." They have their roots firmly in Scripture. They clearly were practiced well when the Methodist movement swept across England and America. But these practices are also practiced well when any congregation lives up to their Kingdom potential, making disciples for a transformed world.

What "The Methodist Way" does is assist United Methodists in being very clear about the specific behaviors, activities and practices which are essential to disciple making. These five core discipling practices move us from abstract intentions to practical and personal directions for ministry.

Cultivating a congregation of <u>passionate worshipers</u>.

Extending <u>radical hospitality</u> to our community and the next generation.

Forming persons in Christ through deep and <u>intentional discipling</u>.

Sending out into the community disciples as <u>salty servants</u>.

Pouring ourselves out in extravagant generosity.

Missions Corner





"Building on Faith" Campaign Followup

The good news is that, as the numbers show (see page 5), you have been so very faithful in your giving. The challenging news is that the cost of the building project is coming in much higher than the anticipated \$3 million.

As reported last month that there was a July 1 contract pricing meeting with the architect and contractor. On July 17 a follow-on meeting was held.

The building project consists of

hard costs which consists of the construction contract price
 and soft costs which include

construction loan interest

builder's risk / liability insurance

assorted fees

furnishings, fixtures and equipment

Soft costs are anticipated at \$300,000 to \$400,000. Hard cost (contract price) is presently at \$3.4 million though subcontractor bids are still being received by the general contractor. The Trustees are seeking to trim costs wherever possible while keeping intact the design strongly supported by the church.

The total price is likely to be between \$3.5 million and \$3.8 million, which is between 17% and 27% beyond the anticipated \$3 million price. Why the increase?

- Site work had been expected to cost \$500,000. Low bid to date is \$650,000.
- Structural steel cost is \$160,000. The building as designed requires much more steel than originally anticipated due to the bell tower feature and provision for a balcony in a future phase.
- Local utilities do not provide ample water supply & pressure for fire protection. Fire pump system cost is \$100,000.

These increases alone come to \$400,000 of the overage.

While the Trustees could put the project out to bid at this point we are choosing to remain with Ronald Scalisi Architects and E.C. Kenyon Construction Company.

"Building on Faith" Campaign Followup...continued

Permits by St Johns River Water Management, the Health Department and the site permit by St Johns County should be in hand by the time you read this. The building permit was successfully pre-reviewed; that permit could come as early as mid-August.

We continue to be on track for a fall groundbreaking.

A Note From Pastor Jeff:

It is Friday, July 25 as I write this. I received sad news today. A man whom I've never met but have come to think highly of died today. Randy Pausch was his name; you may recall me mentioning him during our *Live Like You Were Dying* message series. He wrote the best selling book "The Last Lecture," based on a lecture he gave last September at Carnegie Mellon University where he taught. His story grabbed my attention because we are the same age, we each have three children of the same age, and the university at which he taught is my alma mater.

As Christians we often think of our life to come: an eternity in the presence of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. This is good. It is, after all, a certain future for we who find our salvation in Jesus. What that means for today is that we really are free to live life passionately. Being loved by God the way we are, we needn't worry about our life or our death. Even though he'd been diagnosed with terminal cancer, Randy didn't focus on dying. He focused on *living*, just as he had prior to being diagnosed.

Randy was invited back to Pittsburgh in May to give the charge to graduates at the end of commencement. He'd lived months beyond his prognosis and someone commented, "Wow, so you're really beating the grim reaper." Replied Randy, "We don't beat the reaper by living longer. We beat the reaper by living well and living fully. For the reaper will come for all of us. The question is, what do we do between the time we're born and the time he shows up? 'Cause when he shows up it's too late to do all the things that you were always kind of gonna get around to."

I confess that I'm still learning to live what is most important, to walk the talk I so often talk. Randy's story reminds me that it's a lesson worth learning.
