How to Transition to a New Building

Some surprising advice from Jim Griffith, church planting coach and author of *Ten Most Common Mistakes Made by Church Starts*. Jim writes,

No new initiatives for 12 months. Let your people enjoy the work of their hands. Time must be set aside to live into the new facility and become acclimatized to the changes necessary.

Everyone in the church is far more exhausted than anyone cares to imagine and guilt often replaces euphoria. Misplaced guilt resides just under the surface, usually over not possessing the energy that the pastor requires to meet the “new” goals.

Euphoria dissipates quickly after the opening of the new facility. It most often is replaced by a deflation of emotion(s), somewhat comparable to “post-partum” depression suffered by many birth moms. The end of the building celebration is followed by a long period of “post-partum” depression that sets in to the congregation. This is more pronounced in those who have been intimately involved in the project, but extends to everyone in one degree or another.

Launching new initiatives into the teeth of a tired, exhausted, yet euphoric group sets the church up to have serious personnel issues over the next several months. This, coupled with an exhausted pastor and staff, can deal a significant blow to growth and fruit down the road.



Salty Service

Years ago this question was posed to me: **If your church ceased to exist would your community notice?** The question continues to gnaw at me.

Last summer I preached a message series called The Methodist Way. The five subjects were Passionate Worship, Radical Hospitality, Intentional Discipling, Extravagant Hospitality and Salty Service. **Since last fall I've been looking for ways to increase opportunities for Salty Service.** (That's what those every other month local mission projects have been about.)

What kinds of service are we talking about here? Included would be

- service done to make a positive difference in the lives of others that you would not have done were it not for your relationship to Christ
- service requiring hands-on, face-to-face engagement with the needs of people that you might not ordinarily come to know
- service that pushes you out of your comfort zone to make a real difference in the lives of people

Examples of things I know several of you are involved in would include soup kitchen, detention center, volunteering at the hospital, Hart Felt Ministries, Habitat for Humanity, scouting, even building a relationship with someone far from Christ. And by no means is this an exhaustive list.

So how are we as a church doing? **Beginning April 19 we'll begin measuring our church's salty service.** Each week you'll find a salty service "ticket" in your bulletin like the one reproduced here. If you've served beyond the local church for an hour or more in the week past, you'll be invited to put the card in the offering plate. There's nothing to fill out; we'll simply be tracking the percentage of those in attendance who have served in the past week to see if we're growing as salty servants.

I personally will be challenged to put a card in the plate since so much of my time is devoted to serving in the church. At first I will be aiming to put a card in once every other week! John Wesley said, **"The world is my parish."** For too many congregations (pastors included), the parish has become their world. May it not be so among us.
