Making Disciples for the Transformation of the World

What does a mature Christian look like? How do we create an environment in which Christians are growing to maturity and are being about God's business of transforming the world? How do we guide people in doing what transforms them and the world around them. These questions have been buzzing around me. Here's where I am so far.

Mature Christians are

growing in their relationship with Jesus Christ,

participating in God's transformation of the world,

ministering to people at their point of need:

physical needs, through sharing their time, energy and wealth

emotional needs, through time spent be present with and listening to folks

spiritual needs, through praying with / for people, sharing their faith

working for social justice,

stewarding and renewing the creation,

contagious with their faith.

I think of this as the brochure of what we want ourselves and those who will come to our church to look like.

If that's the brochure, what's the blueprint? How do we grow people toward maturity? Well, we can't. God alone does that with people's cooperation. But we can guide people in doing their part. Consider this as a process to grow into mature Christians.

Invest an hour each week, two at the most in **worshiping God together**. The upper limit makes space for the other activities that God uses to grow us as disciples.

Participate in a grow group (e.g., a small group Bible study or a Sunday School class). **Just one group**, two at the most, so as to make space for the other elements that help move us to maturity.

Involve yourself in a ministry within the church. These include diverse activities such as leading a children's class, serving as a youth counselor, serving as an usher/greeter, or singing in the choir. Keeping in mind that some ministries require just an hour's service a month, the standard is **one hour a week**, two at the most, again leaving space for the other things that grow us up in Christ.

Connect to God's mission in the world. I titled this article, *Making Disciples for the Transformation of the World*. Transforming the world is where we followers of Jesus **spend the rest of our time**. What that looks like is as varied as the ministries within the church. Some will invest themselves primarily in meeting the needs of the poor, some in helping people work through relationship issues, some working in areas of social justice issues. **But it's my prayer that each of us would**

invest something of ourselves in personally reaching people who are not connected to Christ through a local church. After all, making disciples isn't just about bringing each other to maturity; it's also about making *more* disciples.

“Connecting the Unconnected” has been a popular slogan around PVUMC in recent years. Maybe it's time to flesh that out. Try this on for size:

Connecting the Unconnected

Connecting to God through worship

Connecting to each other through small groups

Connecting to ministry in the church

Connecting to God's mission in the world

As the church let's invest our energy in this process of growing Christians and deploying them to join God at work in the world. No doubt this will require discipline - it's easy to load our plates with good things that keep us from the best things. This is a worthy pursuit. The world that God so loved is sorely in need of the transformation that God can bring through us.

Making disciples for the transformation of the world. It expresses rather well, I think the two teachings of Jesus known as the Great Commission and the Great Commandment:

The great commission: Go and make disciples.

The great commandment: Love the Lord your God and love your neighbor as yourself.

Our church, you and I, we are the ones to do it. Let's go.

A Note From Pastor Jeff:

I'm convinced I don't get out enough. On one level, I'm okay with that. Being an introvert I can be content enjoying my family, hanging out in my small group Bible study, working on Sunday messages, ministering to and with people I already know, and participating in the occasional service project. But the Spirit of God presses me in one area in which I lack: connecting with people beyond the church.

While not all my friends are a part of PVUMC, each and every one of them is connected to a local church. In fact, even my circle of *acquaintances* includes just two people who aren't already moving closer to Jesus through a local church. This must change. When I was an engineer, I had a job that put me in touch with Christians, unChristians, even a few people who were antiChristian. Not so my present occupation!

My kids are about to present me with a golden opportunity: they're each beginning to get into extracurricular activities beyond the church. That means I can connect with other parents *if* I'm willing. I'll take that opportunity. But even that won't be enough. I'm committing to spending 5 hours of my "church work time" each week connecting with new people, seeking out those who don't know Jesus or who have fallen out of touch with him. If that's a bit unnatural for me, so what? God really does love these people and I love God enough to do what he wants me to do to reach them. I *can* reach some of them. You can too. Will you invest yourself in others? Will you invite them into God's love through our church? It's been said that the church is the only organization that exists for the people not yet in it. How true.
