Campaign Followup

We are now 17 months into our 36-month capital campaign. We have received **44%** of funds pledged. At 18 months our campaign consultant Cargill Associates tells us we should be at 60%; we'll need to receive an additional \$240,000 against pledges by October 1 to make that interim goal.

The building continues to progress. In early September we expect completion of roofing and stucco and rough in of plumbing, fire sprinkler, mechanical, and electrical. Exterior door installation was delayed due to a loss of parts in shipment to the manufacturer but will be completed early in the month. Drywall is underway. We are optimistic that we will be in by Christmas.

Thanks so much to you have given and are giving, both to the building fund and to the general fund for our week to week operations and missions giving. God is always faithful to us; may we be faithful to him in every way.

Please remember in your prayers our general contractor E.C. Kenyon, also Ronald Scalisi Architects and the subcontractors on the site. May God give them wisdom and keep them safe as they build.

Thank you for your prayers and your financial support of this ambitious project.

Holy Communion and the Flu

Is it safe to receive communion the way we've been serving it at PVUMC? For some time now it's been our practice to distribute individually packaged "wet wipe" sanitizers for those serving communion, Pastor Jeff included. Servers have been instructed to use these wipes prior to handling the elements. Persons receiving the bread touch only the piece they receive, and it's the bread itself (not the fingers) that are dipped into the common cup. These seem like reasonable precautions.

On another note, some may be uneasy with shaking hands or sharing hugs on Sunday mornings. Please be sensitive to those who don't wish to shake or hug... do "the wave" instead. Some, due to youth, agedness or low resistance to germs, may be acting on the advice of their healthcare professionals.

Please be praying for those particularly susceptible to flu and for there to be no large, extended outbreak. And may God continue to use the Lord's Supper and our fellowship to touch, heal and change our hearts, minds and souls.

Money Matters

An Occasional Column on Things Financial

From what I read, the credit crisis of past months has played its part in putting the brakes on the U.S. economy. I've learned that difficulty in securing a loan also handicaps entrepreneurs in third world countries, entrepreneurs who are working to lift themselves and their families out of poverty. This is where **Kiva** enters in.

Kiva (www.kiva.org) is the world's first person-to-person micro-lending website, empowering individuals to lend directly to unique entrepreneurs around the globe. Its mission is to connect people through lending for the sake of alleviating poverty.

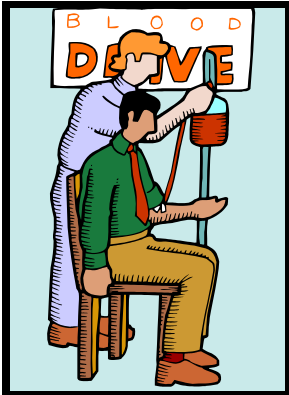
In August I lent \$25 to Margaret Sewanyana Nalongoa, a citizen of Uganda. Seven others joined me so that the field partner (an organization experienced in microfinance in Uganda) could disburse \$200 to her. Margaret is a 42-year-old widow with five children, aged between 13 and 18, all of whom go to school. Margaret owns a small restaurant with an average of 30 customers a day. She works six days a week. She wants to use this loan to buy more bananas and rice, aspiring to see her business grow.

Margaret will repay her loan over eight months. That \$25 I lent her will then be available for me to lend again. But I'm thinking I might increase my loan portfolio by lending to someone else before then.

If you sign on with Kiva, consider joining our team, aptly named *Ponte Vedra United Methodist Church*. (Team membership presently stands at 1. ☺) It would be fun to see how much of a difference together we could make, \$25 at a time.

Please join us on Sunday, September 20 between 9:00am to 12:30pm (Please note the earlier start time). **Don Carson** will be available, starting September 6, after both services at the rear of the worship area to sign up donors. Walk-ins are also gladly accepted.

New this year is the ability to sign up online to donate at our drive. Go to <https://www.thebloodalliance.com>. If you have given blood before, click on I'm a donor. If you are new, click on I am not a donor. Once registered, click on Manage Your Appointments. On the next screen, enter 7931 instead of your zip code (this will take you directly to our blood drives). On our drive page, click on 09/20/2009. On the next page, pick an appointment time.

Anyone who is in good health, at least 17 years old and weighs at least 110 pounds may donate blood every 56 days. We are currently in the 56 day window for our next drive, so please don't give blood between now and September 20. There is no upper age limit to donate, as long as your doctor says it is okay. Please help. Remember, one donation can save up to three lives. Please bring a photo ID to your appointment. Call **Don Carson** at 904-280-2893 if you have any questions.

It's Your Sunday School Hour... Do You Know Where Your Children Are?

“Where do my kids go while I’m going to Sunday School?” Children younger than Kindergarten who are checked into the nursery always remain there until the parent or grandparent who checked them in checks them out.

Here’s where the children K - 5th grade who leave from Children’s Time to participate in Kingdom Kids go:

For those attending 9:30 worship, children remain in their Kingdom Kids classroom until their parents pick them up or 10:45. Those who will stay through the second hour are escorted to the worship space where they are entrusted to the second hour’s Kingdom Kids leader while their parents are in Sunday School. After 11:00 Children’s Time, these kids return to the Kingdom Kids room for a second session. They’re ready for their parents at the end of the traditional service or the end of their parents’ Sunday School class.
