

Campaign Followup

We are now 18 months into our 36-month capital campaign. We have received **56%** of funds pledged. Our midpoint goal was 50% and we are delighted to have surpassed it. Well done, church!

The building continues to progress. Each weekday finds an impressive array of subcontractors on the site. Work on the building's exterior should be completed early in the month. Installation of a critical fire protection subsystem we'd hoped not to have to do (10,000 gallon water tank and pump due to inadequate municipal water pressure and flow) will be underway this month. Everything else simply moves forward, week by week: electrical, mechanical, drywall, etc. We anticipate being in the building by Christmas.

Thanks so much to you have given and are giving, both to the building fund and to the general fund for our week to week operations and missions giving. Extra thanks to those of you who are going the 2nd (or 3rd!) mile by giving to *Furnishing our Facility*. See the current status online at www.pv-umc.org. Also, to those of you coming out to 76 to pray on Saturdays: Your prayers are powerful and effective. God bless you!

Please remember in your prayers our general contractor E.C. Kenyon, also Ronald Scalisi Architects and the subcontractors on the site. May God give them wisdom and keep them safe as they build.

Invest & Invite

How will we fill our new building with disciples of Jesus Christ who are transforming the world?

While it's true that some will come simply out of curiosity ("I wonder what that building looks like on the inside? I wonder who those people are?") most will come on the elbow of a friend who invites them. Be investing yourself in at least one relationship with someone who doesn't do church. Then invite them to church!

And for those who, by the grace of God, show up on the church doorstep, we must still **Invest & Invite**. Invest in getting to know them and Invite them to join in a small group for Bible study or serving. (A small group of any variety is a great way to invest ourselves in people new to us.)

A Note From Pastor Jeff:

Over the years I've attended a number of seminars and training events focusing on leadership, on how to grow your church, etc. There's a lot of talk about vision and strategy and it's not unhelpful. But I always come away thinking that, at the end of the day, it's God who grows people and God who grows churches. The apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians chapter 3,

I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow.

People like to pull strategies from the Bible but I wonder if that doesn't miss the point: Faithful churches follow Jesus, being guided by the Holy Spirit, as did the early church. I have to believe that, while we do the work, it's God who must lead us in that work and God who grants any increase. Let's ask God to do this.

Let's be people who plant the seed of the gospel. Let's be people who water the seed. But above all else, let's be people who keep their eyes on Jesus.
