Lending to the Poor

In the September 2009 edition of *The Wave* I wrote about a loan I made to a woman in Africa. In August I lent \$25 to **Margaret Sewanyana Nalongoa**, a citizen of **Uganda**. Seven others joined me so that the field partner (an organization experienced in microfinance in Uganda) could disburse \$200 to her. Margaret is a 42-year-old widow with five children, aged between 13 and 18, all of whom go to school. Margaret owns a small restaurant with an average of 30 customers a day; she works six days a week. She used the loan to buy more bananas and rice, aspiring to see her business grow.

Margaret has repaid her loan over the eight months. That \$25 I lent her was made available for me to lend again. I decided to increase my “loan portfolio” by adding funds and then making two new loans.

Samar Gull leads a group in **Afghanistan** in the business of sewing quilts. The group is using my loan to buy some essential materials like needles and cloth for her business, helping to expand that business.

Daniel Niyonsenga has owned a shop in **Rwanda** for two years, selling products like cooking oil, water, juice, soap and so on. Daniel is using my loan to purchase more products which will allow him to earn more profits. With this loan Daniel expects to increase the number of staff in his business.

How did I connect with Margaret, Samar and Daniel? Through **Kiva** (www.kiva.org), the world’s first person-to-person micro-lending website, empowering individuals to lend directly to unique entrepreneurs around the globe. Kiva’s mission is to connect people through lending for the sake of alleviating poverty.

Organizations can’t lend through Kiva, only individuals. **Would you like to join me in lending some of your resources to a person or group?** Sign on with Kiva and consider joining our team, aptly named *Ponte Vedra United Methodist Church*. (Team membership presently stands at 1. ☺) It would be fun to see how much of a difference together we could make, \$25 at a time.

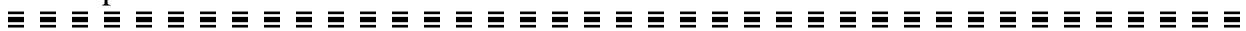

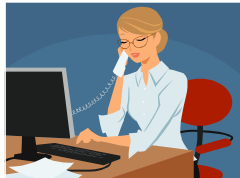

Campaign Followup

At 26 months into our 36-month *Building on Faith* capital campaign, we have received nearly **76%** of funds pledged. Well done, church!

To those who have pledged to the *Building on Faith* capital campaign, please continue to give against those pledges. (And thank you very much for what you've given to date.) To those who have so freely given to the building fund outside the campaign, we thank you too!

At present we're required to pay interest; principal payments are optional. Beginning in January the balance of the loan will be amortized over 19 years and we will be paying both principal and interest. Every gift now given to *Building on Faith* or the building fund reduces the principal we owe as well as the interest we pay today *and* the interest we'll pay over the next 19 years. To lessen the burden of debt on those coming alongside us now and those who will follow us is an incredible gift to them; it will allow the church of the next generation to focus more greatly on bringing the good news to their generation.

While *Building on Faith* does not conclude until April 1, 2011, you who are able might consider prepaying the balance of your pledge to immediately reduce the principal of the loan and the interest due each month.

Those of you who have become a part of our congregation since the launch of the campaign two years ago, might you also give a special gift to reduce the debt? Designate your gift "Building Fund."

Above all, receive the thanks of a grateful church for each dollar given, many of which have been given sacrificially. And we thank and praise God who has brought us this far on our journey. While the building is now built, may God bless us to continue building his church.
