## *Report on Annual Conference 2011*

I had the privilege of attending the Florida Annual Conference in Tampa, Florida June 1-4 as your Lay Delegate. “**Living as Peacemakers**” was this year’s theme with approximately 2,000 Florida United Methodist attending. At this year’s Conference, members focused on electing lay and clergy delegates from the Florida Conference to the 2012 General Conference, which will be held in Tampa April 24-May 4, 2012 and the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference, to be held July 18 -20, 2012. Our own youth minister, **Kelly Minter, was elected as an alternate delegate to the Jurisdictional Conference.**

Thursday afternoon, **the bishop officially presented us with our church charter.** Kelly Minter, Tucker Holland, Reid and Rion Johnson were also present along with Pastor Jeff and me for this honor. The only other church receiving a charter was River of Life, also from the Northeast District and St. Johns County. **PVUMC was also recognized in a report as having one of the largest increases in 2010 average worship attendance over the previous 4 year average.**

The four days were filled with many challenging speakers, inspirational worship services, informative workshops, interesting exhibits and a lot of business reports on the status of our conference. They kept us busy from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm. I gained a much better understanding of the mission, ministry and structure of the United Methodist Church after attending Annual Conference.

There are four denomination-wide areas of emphasis that the Florida Conference supports. They are:

- Developing principled Christian leaders
- Starting new congregations and revitalizing existing ones
- Engaging in ministry to the poor
- Fighting diseases of poverty, such as malaria, and HIV/AIDS

# Money Matters

## Do Good While Doing Well

Do good while earning 2.25%!

Any Florida resident may open a participation account in the The Florida United Methodist Foundation's Development Fund with a minimum investment of \$100. Money deposited in the Development Fund earns a higher rate of interest (presently **2.25%**) than most commercial savings, money market or certificate of deposit accounts. Interest is accrued from the time of deposit until the time of withdrawal. Money is available, without penalty, on demand. Earnings are reported quarterly.

Investors in the Development Fund also earn the satisfaction of knowing that their money is being used to further the work of the United Methodist Church. The Development Fund, with more than \$83 million in assets, supplies low-interest loans to churches and conference agencies. Since 1976, the Development Fund has loaned more than \$120 million in loans conference-wide, with no defaults. (Ponte Vedra United Methodist Church is among the borrowing churches.) Every loan has been repaid in full and no investor has lost a penny by investing in the Development Fund.

The interest rate is set by the Foundation Board of Directors and is subject to review and/or change on a quarterly basis. ## Coming Soon! 'The Hole in Our Gospel' Sep 25 - Nov 6

### *Wesley - The Movie... Save the Date!*



The year is 1732, a time of spiritual decline in England. The gulf between rich and poor is pronounced. Cheap methods of producing gin have created the 18th century's version of a crack epidemic among the lower classes.

Into this world steps a self-righteous young Anglican priest named John Wesley. Having grown up believing he had to earn his way into Heaven through good works, Wesley spent a great portion of his time visiting prisons, studying the Bible and praying – all to escape the fires of Hell himself.

His rigorous self-discipline attracts the attention of General Oglethorpe, who has just been appointed governor of the new colony of Georgia. Oglethorpe invites the young Wesley to serve as chaplain of the newly settled community of Savannah. Inspired by an encounter with a native American, John and his brother Charles travel to America with dreams of evangelizing the native peoples.

During the long journey to America, a terrible storm nearly sinks their ship, and Wesley's confidence in his own faith is shaken. He is astounded to see the small group of Moravian missionaries calmly singing during the storm, confident in their faith.

Upon reaching Georgia, he falls in love with the beautiful young Sophy, niece of the local magistrate. But Wesley has made a commitment not to marry, and their star-crossed love affair ends in bitterness and a lawsuit. Charles fairs no better as chaplain of Fort Frederica, when he is sent home early in disgrace.



## *Wesley – The Movie... Save the Date! Continued...*

When John returns to England bereft and depressed, he finds that his brother Charles has found the spiritual solace and peace that Wesley's heart is so desperately lacking. Through the friendship of a young Moravian missionary, John finally finds "heart religion," the manifestation of grace that he has been searching for.

With renewed energy and deep faith, Wesley begins a revolutionary movement that will ultimately transform the face of England and the fledgling country across the Atlantic. Under his leadership, the first shelters for battered women are begun, the poor of England are empowered and transformed by saving faith, prison reforms are started, and the anti-slavery movement begins. Across the former colonies, Methodist lay preachers on horseback reach the remotest frontier settlements with the message of the Gospel.

This true story, filled with adventure and challenge, is one that is a natural for the silver screen. It has a bit of the swashbuckling energy of *Master and Commander* and some of the bittersweet romance of *Sense and Sensibility* – and it is a film that conveys a powerful message pertinent to our times.

## *Coming Thursday Evenings: DISCIPLE III Remember Who You Are*

Resident in the title is the driving idea in this study – the connection between memory and identity as the people of God. The word *You* in the title is meant to be heard both in its singular form (the individual) and in its plural form (the community). We are a community of memory. Participants in this thirty-two-week study will read the major and minor Old Testament prophets, with the exception of Daniel, and will read the thirteen letters traditionally attributed to Paul. To establish the historical context in which the prophets spoke for God, daily reading assignments also draw on the books of Deuteronomy through Chronicles. Study of the prophets will follow their historical sequence rather than their biblical sequence. The dating of Paul's letters influences the sequence of their study.

"Remember Who You Are" is prepared for those who have completed DISCIPLE I "Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study".

Dear Children and Parents of PVUMC,

Take time this August to be still! So very soon it will be time to hurry to school, hurry to sports teams, hurry to music lessons, hurry to clubs and yes, even hurry to church activities. Savor these final weeks of vacation! My grandmother (who turned 100 years old this July) tells me that HER grandmother used to tell her to make the most of every summer day and use the memories to keep warm through the winter months! Here are a few slow suggestions:

1. Sit in the grass and watch ants. Give them something to carry. Watch them climb over and around obstacles. Where do they get that strength?
2. Go outside in the very early morning and just sit. Listen to the birds talk to each other. What do you think they are saying?
3. Look at the stars. (Remember the story of Abraham from Kingdom Kids?) Which star do you think is yours? Ask your grandparents if THEY know any star stories.
4. Write a letter and send it in the mail with a stamp. Maybe the person you write to will send YOU a letter, too! But be patient, this kind of mail takes time. What other good things take time?
5. Listen to a book on a CD. Imagine what the characters and places look like. Long ago, people listened to stories on the radio instead of watching television. Try listening to a baseball game on the radio. Does the announcer's voice make it more exciting? Can you see what he is seeing? Could you make your own radio play? What other things can you know and see without using your eyes?
6. Make cookies and taste absolutely everything you put in the bowl – the flour, the sugar – even the baking soda. Some of it you will like - some of it you won't like so much. When you eat the cookie can you taste each ingredient – or just the cookie? Why is that? What does it tell you about the ingredients God puts in YOUR life to make YOU one delicious cookie!?
7. Ask your mom or dad if you can buy a fruit or vegetable that you have never tried before. Now, you have to try it. How many different kinds of fruits and vegetables do you think God made? How many can you count that you have tried? What other blessings do you think God made for you that you haven't even tried yet?

Enjoy going slow for awhile. When you do, you will find out new things about yourself and you will find out new things about God. He has so much to share with you! Happy Summer!

And when he finally showed himself he kept his mouth with its missing tooth closed. Spencer just doesn't like to be fussed over. Then again, he wouldn't be happy if no one paid him any attention.

We returned from our travels a few days before my vacation was up. Jill and the kids came to PVUMC while I worshiped alone at another local church. On the one hand, I was glad that this church had given up the practice of making guests stand and introduce themselves. (Most people don't like that; I'm one of them.) On the other hand, I was saddened that no one said hello or introduced themselves to me. It wasn't until someone recognized me on my way to the parking lot that I experienced a personal touch.

We have some folks trained as "shepherds" to greet our guests. (See *Volunteer Opportunities* inside if you'd like to serve in this way.) But what if each of us took a small role in this every week? Here are some ideas:

- (1) for the first 3 minutes after worship, talk only to people you don't know well
- (2) speak with anyone within 10 feet of you that you do not know well
- (3) connect guests with others in the congregation of a similar age & stage in life

Ours is a great church home. May it become the home of many more.
