Lending to the Poor through Kiva

From time to time I talk about how much joy I've gotten in the second half of my life through giving. Three years ago I discovered **the joy of lending**. I've lent money to third world entrepreneurs who farm, operate dairies, establish general stores, make shoes, expand their restaurants, sell fish and knit. 10 of my loans have been repaid in full; I have only one loan in my portfolio that ended with a loss. Everyone else is in the process of paying back their loans.

Bayanmunh was 44 when I lent her \$25 to start a shoe-making business out of her home in Mongolia. A bunch of us got together online to meet her total loan request of \$1,250 to be used for materials. (She already owned the equipment.) She paid off the 18 month loan early.

How did I connect with Bayanmunh and the other entrepreneurs? Through **Kiva** (www.kiva.org), the world's first person-to-person micro-lending website, empowering individuals to lend directly to unique entrepreneurs around the globe. Kiva's mission is to connect people through lending for the sake of alleviating poverty.

Organizations can't lend through Kiva, only individuals. **Would you like to join me in lending some of your resources to a person or group?** Sign on with Kiva and consider joining our team, aptly named *Ponte Vedra United Methodist Church*. Our 8 team members have lent \$1,250 in 45 loans. (As money gets repaid, we get to lend it over again.) If this intrigues you, sign on! We can make a difference in the world, \$25 at a time.

“Teaching Moment”

I answer your questions in this column so feel free to call the office, ask in person, or email me with your Bible questions.

Question: Why do we take international mission trips? Why not just help out those in our local community?

Answer: As a pastor who leads teams on international mission trips to Panama and Costa Rica through Faithful Servant Missions, I am often asked, “Why do churches take international mission trips? Why not just help out those at home? Actually, there is a Biblical foundation for being involved in mission work both at home AND abroad. In Acts 1:8, Jesus says, “And when the Holy Spirit comes on you, you will be able to be my witnesses in Jerusalem, all over Judea and Samaria, even to the ends of the earth.” In Jesus’ day, Jerusalem represented the local community. Here at PVUMC, we are extremely active in local missions. I lead teams to St. Francis House in St. Augustine each month to feed the homeless. And many other people connected to our church serve in Hart Felt Ministries, BEAM and many other local ministries that have a huge impact here in the Jacksonville area. Moreover, in Acts 1:8, Jesus urges us to press on to “Judea and Samaria”. During Jesus’ lifetime, “Judea and Samaria” was a regional designation. In effect, he is saying that we should also be actively involved in the regions where we live. This year, our church will participate in several regional mission trips involving both adults and students. Now, the last part of Acts 1:8 mentions “the ends of the earth.” By using this phrase, Jesus fully intends for us to be involved in ministry abroad. For many years, PVUMC has supported the La Sierra Church in Cuba. And this year we partnered with Faithful Servant Missions to send seven missionaries to Caizan, Panama to work on an orphanage campus called Manos de Fe (Hands of Faith). When it comes to ministry, Jesus doesn’t call us to stop at the county or state line. Instead, he calls us out of our comfort zones where we realize that we must fully rely on him in order to accomplish the ultimate mission of making fully devoted followers of Christ.

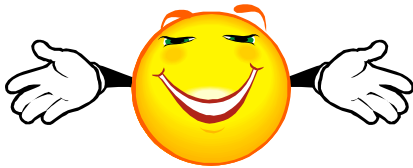

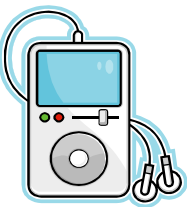
