Did You Know?

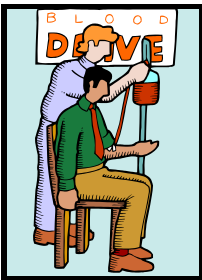

Saving Lives - Ponte Vedra UMC Blood Drive, Sunday, September 9



Beat the crowds, sign up on-line and get the best time that fits your schedule. Just go to www.igiveblood.com. Click on *Give Blood* then choose *Make an Appointment*. Choose *Make an Appointment* and enter 7931 in the zip or fund code box and select our church name.

Anyone who is in good health, at least 17 years old and weighs at least 110 pounds may donate blood every 56 days. We are currently in the 56 day window for our next drive, so please don't give blood between now and September 9. There is no upper age limit to donate, as long as your doctor says it is okay. Those who have visited Panama, Costa Rica and other countries known to carry malaria within the past year are not eligible to donate blood.

I answer your questions in this column so feel free to call the office, ask in person, or email me with your Bible questions.

Question: So, what did the church team do on the recent international mission trip to Panama?

Answer: During the week of June 16-23rd, Ponte Vedra UMC sent seven international missionaries to Panama: **Mary Kay Ashby, Jeffery and Hilton Ashby, Shelia Epperson, Austin and Kathleen Patneau**, and yours truly. We worked at an orphanage called **Manos De Fe** ("Hands of Faith") on the campus of **Faithful Servant Missions**. We completed several projects on the orphanage grounds including building steps from one of the cottages to the multipurpose building and landscaping a portion of the campus. In addition, we participated in a feeding program by going out to the local community and offering food to those in need. The feeding ministry is designed to be temporary relief for people until they are better equipped to provide for themselves. Our focus is to give families a hand up not a hand out. We also took clothing with us on the trip and gave it out in several local neighborhoods. It was truly touching just how grateful the children were for a simple gift like a shirt or a pair of pants. The gratitude of the Panamanian people challenged me to be more grateful for the gifts I enjoy. And, one of those gifts is being your teaching pastor at Ponte Vedra UMC! Love to you all and enjoy your summer.

Men's Bible Study on Revelation Begins Thursday, August 2

The **Thursday morning men's Bible study** begins a study on **Revelation** on **August 2**. This compelling study by Dr. James Efirm dispels the myths about end times and reclaims the hope for all Christians found in this most misunderstood book of the Bible. We'll learn about the conflict between good and evil and the meaningful symbolism used to help early Christians keep the faith during hard times. The Revelation study consists of 16 DVD video lessons lasting approximately 20 minutes each followed by conversation.

The group meets upstairs (enter by tower stairwell) on **Thursdays from 8 to 9am**. Men, we'd love to have you join us! Also, this curriculum will be available to other groups within the church if your small group or Sunday School class would like to study Revelation.

Disciple 1 Class Begins in September

Message from Mrs. Jenn ~



This summer my family had the opportunity to go overseas to visit family in Germany and Holland. It was a great opportunity for our children to meet relatives they did not know and play with cousins (even when they could not speak the same language). I have been to Europe several times in my life, but this was the first trip with our children and to see the countries through their eyes. What struck me most was seeing God's presence everywhere we went. On the tops of the highest mountains in Bavaria there is a cross at every peak. Along the roads there are small altars made available for people to stop and pray. And everywhere you look there is evidence of God's love and creation. I also realized that these awe inspiring places were a great place to talk to our children about God and Jesus' love for us all. Below are some ideas for family devotionals in our own community.

The Zoo: A showcase for God's creativity. Hunt for five of the most bizarre animal facts. Discuss God's purpose in His specific design of each animal. Try to find an animal for each letter of the alphabet. Make an A to Z book. Talk about Adam's job of naming the animals. What names would you have chosen? You could discuss Noah's faith in building the ark. Sing the "Rise and Shine" song and eat animal crackers. Upon your return, make monkey bread or decorate cupcakes to look like animals. Play a game of animal charades or animal races (hop like a kangaroo, slither like a snake, or walk like an elephant.)

The Beach: Another awesome display of God's handiwork. Fill a small container with sand. How many granules would you estimate are in there? Talk about Psalm 139:17-18, "*How precious to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them! Were I to count them, they would outnumber the grains of sand.*" Go on a hunt for seashells and challenge your children to find two that are exactly the same. Find a recipe for a "sand dirt dessert" and make it when you get home.

The Backyard: Go cloud watching. Read Psalm 19:1, "*The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of His hands.*" Replicate the clouds with a cotton ball art project. Plant a vegetable or flower garden and take care of it daily. (Even dead plants are a great object lesson if things don't work out!) Read Mark 4:30-32, the parable of the mustard seed. Play games, have fun, and be silly. Jesus promises us life to the full. What does that mean? Hunt for bugs. Find a caterpillar and a butterfly. Discuss 2 Corinthians 5:17.

Enjoy and have a wonderful last month of summer!
