## Lending to the Poor through Kiva

From time to time I talk about how much joy I've gotten through giving. Four years ago I discovered **the joy of** *lending*. I've lent money to third world entrepreneurs who farm, operate dairies, establish general stores, make shoes, expand their restaurants, sell fish and knit. I've made 28 loans totaling \$800 so far. (Lots of "recycling" as loans have been repaid; I've invested just over \$200.)

**Estela** is 40 years old and lives in her own home with her children who are in school. She's had a small bakery in a residential area of El Salvador for several years; her goods are in high demand. This is how she's been able to pay for many household costs. I lent Estela \$25 (of a total \$900 loan) to buy bread-making ingredients like flour, yeast, etc. The loan will allow her to continue her business, increase income, and give her family the quality of life they deserve.

How did I connect with Estela and the other entrepreneurs? Through **Kiva** (www.kiva.org), the world's first person-to-person micro-lending website, empowering individuals to lend directly to unique entrepreneurs around the globe. Kiva's mission is to connect people through lending for the sake of alleviating poverty.

Organizations can't lend through Kiva, only individuals. Would you like to join me in lending some of your resources to a person or group? Sign on with Kiva and consider joining our team, aptly named *Ponte Vedra United Methodist Church*. Our 9 team members have lent \$2,525 in 95 loans. (As money gets repaid, we get to lend it over again.) We can *Change the World*, \$25 at a time.

### Fill Grocery Bags for B.E.A.M.





A Note From Life is such a fragile thing. We have opportunity to remember this daily just by watching and reading the news... People die unexpectedly from natural causes, natural disasters, unnatural acts of violence, and accidents. Maybe we become numb to it because we hear about it all the time. And here it all the time. And because most of the time these are other people's friends and families.

> I'm thinking about this today because of my friend Jimmy Jones' recent tonsil cancer diagnosis, surgery and upcoming radiation and chemotherapy. We expect Jimmy to come through this well and we're certainly praying that way. But we all know this is not the outcome for everyone. What do we do with that?

> I suppose we could fret about whether I, my friend, or my family member will be next to get hit by a bus or cancer or whatever. But that doesn't seem right for followers of Jesus who are trusting themselves and those they love to God, here and in the hereafter. This, I think, is a better way:

> Instead of cowering in fear, celebrate the people in your life. Throw a party if you like, but I believe the best way to celebrate people is by simply *enjoying* them. You will bless them and you yourself will be blessed. While you're at it, make some space for people beyond your circle. Celebrate them. Enjoy them. Love them. Bless them. And don't be surprised if in doing so, you begin to change the world.
