## JAARS update

What a great week! JAARS estimates that between 700 and 900 came to the JAARS Day event. We arrived Friday afternoon and began preparing things for the children's event. **Frances Thomas** and **Cynthia Jordaan** did a great job helping prepare and staff the children's activity table. The airplanes and helicopters flew all day until 6:00pm. During the week Frances and Cynthia helped prepare crafts for the children's Christmas event, Frances also worked in the Medical clinic, Cynthia did research projects and **Dan Thomas** worked in the aircraft hangar and painting houses. But more importantly, getting to know the missionaries and volunteer staff and seeing God working in this ministry was fantastic beyond words. We were able to have dinner one evening with missionaries and learned about the cultures of the remote people groups. Short and long term volunteers supply more than 50% of the workers that enable the translators to do their work. There are now 1,997 languages awaiting translation, most in villages and communities that are difficult to reach due to geographical and political environments. The goal is to have the New Testament translated into all languages by 2025.

Quite often we hear people returning from mission trip saying they got more than they gave. We can only echo that statement. On the surface there is not the emotional tug of a disaster recovery mission trip that generates a desire to help, but the work that Wycliffe JAARS does takes the Good News to those that will never hear it unless someone puts it in a language these people groups can understand. The work environment at JAARS was fantastic and represents what those of us in the business world hope to attain.

## *Money Matters*

### *Study: Christians Who Tithe Have Healthier Finances Than Those Who Don't*

The finances of Christians who tithe are generally healthier than the finances of those who do not, according to a new report that takes a close look at the financial, spiritual and giving practices of people who give 10 percent or more of their income away to churches and charities each year.

Researchers compared tithers to non-tithers using nine financial health indicators, and found that tithers were better off in every category. Among tithers, for example, 80 percent have no unpaid credit card bills, 74 percent don't owe anything on their cars, 48 percent own their home and 28 percent are debt free.

"The weird thing is, a tither looks at that and says to himself, 'Well I'm better off because I give.' A non-tither looks at that and says, 'Oh, they give because they're better off,'" said Brian Kluth, founder of the study and Maximum Generosity, who called the findings "unprecedented."

There are an estimated 10 million Christians in the U.S. who tithe more than \$50 billion annually, according to a press release for the annual State of the Plate report. The report encompasses survey responses from 4,413 tithers from all 50 states and a variety of different churches and income levels.

The fifth annual study reveals that 97 percent of tithers make giving to their local church a priority, and 63 percent started tithing between their childhood and their twenties. It also found that 70 percent give based on their gross income rather than their net income, and 77 percent give more than the traditional 10 percent.

"Never before has this group been studied, and I think for every pastor and church leader and parachurch leader it would be valuable if they understand this," Kluth told The Christian Post. "We're in the midst of a 40-year decline in the percentage that Christians give, and we need to see a generosity movement in America, that Christians re-embrace generosity as a spiritual value, but not for the sake of the church budget, but because of the Bible. Churches have made giving all about the budget, and it's not about the budget, it's all about the Bible."

Jill drove Abby to the hospital. Abby told her as they turned onto Roscoe, “**I wish I could go back in time.**” (As in, “and not hopped up there in the first place.”) Ah, regret. How many times have you said to yourself, I wish I hadn’t done (or said) that! Of course you can’t go back. Fortunately, most of the time the consequences of these actions are little more than nuisances. Then there are the choices that affect eternity. Having just preached from Matthew 25 it’s clear to me that how we relate to the hungry, the stranger, the naked, the sick, those in prison, the “least of these”... these are choices that affect our eternity, as well as the here and now of the neighbors we’re called to love.

May God grant us ears to hear and wisdom to choose well. As we follow Christ into the world, may the world be changed... through us.
