JAARS Mission Trip, June 8-14

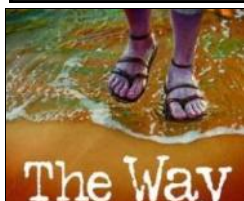
Join **Pastor Jimmy Jones** and **Dan Thomas** on a service trip to Wycliffe/JAARS in North Carolina this summer to do a light construction project. There will be an informational meeting Sunday, March 9, 10:30 - 11:00am in room 209. A team will consist of 10 people. The cost is \$250 for double occupancy lodging and transportation. Meals are not included.

Travel to Wycliffe/JAARS just 6 hours north of us and learn about people like Joseph, a fierce warrior and respected leader who had led numerous wars and who now lives his life for the wellbeing of others after becoming a follower of Jesus. Joseph and the 300,000 in his people group are learning how to lead lives for Jesus not for the plunder of war. Joseph read the Bible aloud slowly in a language used for trade, a language he barely understands, to his people for the first time with tears streaming down his cheeks. The 300,000 people in Joseph's community are waiting on a Bible that speaks to them in a language they understand. Will you help share the message of God's love and redemption to a people eager to hear it by helping with a service project at JAARS HQ? 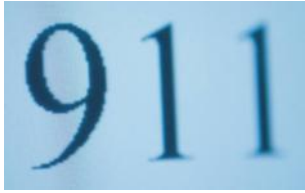

Medical Emergency Protocol Published



The medical emergency protocol below is offered by the worship planning team, having been reviewed by the head ushers, lay leader and Council on Ministries chair and distributed to the ushers, greeters, shepherds and anyone else for whom it might prove useful. May we be so blessed as to never have to execute the plan!

In the event of a medical emergency in the sanctuary during worship:

Head usher and/or **nearest usher** assesses the person's condition and immediately phones (or has someone else phone) 9-1-1 from the sound booth phone. (Use of a land line allows for instant access to the church's street address by emergency services.)

The sound engineer places the phone on the front ledge of the sound booth for easy access by the head usher of that day's team (or person he/she designates) to dial "9" and make the call to 9-1-1. Positioning the phone here will also allow for the person calling 9-1-1 to give and receive information.

If the medical emergency may indicate it, **an usher** shall retrieve the A.E.D. (automated external defibrillator) from its kitchen shelf and bring it to those offering aid.

The keyboard player shall move to the keyboard.

As all of this is happening, **the pastor** leading worship will offer a prayer for the person who is suffering the emergency, during which **the keyboard** player shall softly play a hymn. After **the pastor** prays, he or she shall invite the congregation to pray in small groups or individually where they are. This may continue until the crisis has passed or until the person has received or been removed to appropriate medical care. *If people begin leaving the sanctuary / property they may impede the arrival of emergency personnel. Invite people to remain in their seats except for those rendering aid.* (If it's nearing 10:30am we face the prospect of more people arriving for the next service; it may be wise to dismiss those who would be leaving so we don't jam the parking lot with more cars than it can handle, impeding the arrival of emergency personnel.)

It will be the pastor's discretion which acts of worship shall follow the crisis.

This plan may be modified to whatever extent necessary given the nature of the emergency.

A Note From Pastor Jeff:

I came across this story circulating in Detroit about the early days of Henry Ford and Ford Motor Company. It concerns a machinist with the company who had “borrowed,” over a period of years, tools and automobile parts. Although it was against company policy, “everybody did it,” and management did nothing about it.

One day, however, the machinist came to faith in Christ. He was baptized and became a believer who took his baptism seriously. The day after his baptism, he gathered up all the tools he had collected over the years, loaded them into his pickup, took them to the plant and presented them to the foreman with his confession and request for forgiveness.

The foreman was so overcome by the man’s honesty that he cabled Henry Ford himself, who was visiting a European plant. After reading about the entire event in detail, Ford immediately cabled back this response: “Dam up the Detroit River,” he said, “and baptize the entire plant.”

An amusing story, to be sure. And it raises this very good question: **Are you taking your baptism seriously?**
