

Money Matters

Among the financial practices Jill and I follow are **making a budget** and **keeping a record** of where we spend our money. A lot of people think negatively about budgeting but I like this description: A **budget is simply a way of giving every dollar a name.**

Jill and I look at our budget as a plan. We plan to give this much, save that much, spend this amount on food, that amount on clothing, gas, etc. And we track where the dollars actually go. Sometimes we go over budget on this category and under on that. But year after year we hit our giving target (you always do when you give first), we come very close to our savings target, and we never take on consumer debt.

I recently came across these words of author George Fooshee re: keeping records and making a budget:

If someone were to tell me that he's going to run his business without keeping any records, I would say this is downright stupid. And it is even worse for one who really wants to be a good steward of the Lord's money.

A man I know to whom I have given financial counsel thought he was doing great because he had to borrow only \$300 in the last eight months. When I asked him how he managed to get along so well, he admitted he had sold his week of vacation for \$500 and had some overtime pay.

I figured that the fellow was actually spending \$175 per month more than he was making during the eight-month period, despite the one-time windfall of getting rid of his vacation and working overtime. A year from now, at his present rate of overspending, he would owe \$2100 more, with interest adding to his debt totaling more than \$30 each month.

By keeping good records, having a plan and being honest with oneself, a person won't get into financial trouble. I seldom see financially successful people who don't keep good records.

By wisdom a house is built, and by understanding it is established; by knowledge the rooms are filled with all precious and pleasant riches. – Proverbs 24:3-4

It pays to know where your money goes!

That's not entirely accurate; there were loads of hard-boiled eggs dyed in a variety of pastel colors but only one raw egg. I had been inconvenienced by Easter.

> On the one hand, I'm embarrassed to say such a thing. (Inconvenienced by Easter? Come on!) On the other hand, I got to thinking that this ought to be the norm. Christ's resurrection means new life for each person who chooses to follow him. (New life now, not just following our own resurrection.) By definition, new life is different from old life, and that disturbs the way we're used to living. When Jesus calls me to follow him, that means putting down what I'm used to doing and, well, following him. For those of us who like the lives we've been carving out for ourselves, that can be mighty inconvenient. And, I will say, worth it.
