Fly to JAARS and Back Saturday, October 10



Approximately 2,000 people groups in the world today lack a Bible translation in a language they understand. Bible translation is about offering the best resource for knowing God. Having a Bible in your own language can be transformational, for an individual or an entire commu-

nity. JAARS provides practical, day-to-day support to assist in making Bible translation possible.

On October 10, **Dan Thomas** will be leading a group on a one day trip to JAARS (located just south of Charlotte, NC) to learn about Bible translation and literacy work around the world. There are 32 seats available on the flight provided by Missionary Flights International leaving round-trip out of the St Augustine airport. The flight will leave in the morning and return that evening. The estimated donation per person will be around \$300 or less depending on the number of participants.

Lending to the Poor through Kiva

From time to time I talk about how much joy I've gotten through giving. Six years ago I discovered **the joy of** *lending*. I've lent money to third world entrepreneurs who farm, operate dairies, establish general stores, make shoes, expand their restaurants, sell fish and knit. I've made 40 loans totaling \$1,100 so far. (Lots of "recycling" as loans have been repaid. My investment totals \$268.)

Oscar lives in Concepción, Paraguay. He has a blacksmith's shop in his house and has been producing chairs and barbecue gridirons for the last three years. He delivers his products weekly to shops in the city and to some street vendors. I lent Oscar \$25 (of a total \$1,225 loan) to buy metal to continue to manufacture the products that he sells. He has repaid 54% of the loan to date.

How did I connect with Oscar and the other entrepreneurs? Through **Kiva** (<u>www.kiva.org</u>), the world's first person-to-person micro-lending website, empowering individuals to lend directly to unique entrepreneurs around the globe. Kiva's mission is to connect people through lending for the sake of alleviating poverty.

Organizations can't lend through Kiva, only individuals. **Would you like to join me in lending some of your resources to a person or group?** Sign on with Kiva and consider joining our team, aptly named *Ponte Vedra United Methodist Church*. Our 11 team members have made 187 loans totaling \$4,725. (As money gets repaid, we get to lend it over again.) If this intrigues you, sign on! We can change the world, \$25 at a time.


